PART OF THE ECS GRANT

Alliance District funding is a portion of an Alliance District's ECS entitlement. It is NOT a separate grant.

- Alliance District funding is part of the ECS grant. This funding is conditional upon a district complying with its Alliance District plan as well as other statutory requirements.
- For FY 23-FY 27, there are 36 districts: the 33 lowest-performing districts and the three that were among the lowest-performing in the previous program cycle (FY 18-FY 22). These districts must participate in order to receive the entire ECS grant.
- The Alliance District portion of ECS funding goes directly to districts while the non-Alliance portion goes to towns.
